

Harmonious Parking in Piddington

Following concerns raised by parishioners, the Parish council invited all residents to a meeting in June 2016 to discuss parking issues in the village. This gave the Council a better feel for what the community is looking for.

The objective is to achieve harmonious, self-regulating parking allowing emergency vehicles clear access.

One of the steps agreed is to appeal to people's good nature and common sense by asking them to park with consideration and therefore avoiding the introduction of heavy parking enforcement.

Please follow these Considerate Parking Principles:

- Ensure one pavement is always kept clear with enough room for buggies to pass. In King street, this is the right-hand side going downhill. Vehicles can park on the left-hand pavement but keep well over to allow clear access for emergency vehicles. The police confirm they think this is an acceptable policy.
- Please do not park where you will block access to someone's driveway.
- If you have a driveway or parking space please use it to free up roadside parking spots.
- Don't leave odd sized gaps between cars, maybe another car can be parked if we adjusted the gap.
- Ask your visitors to park equally thoughtfully.

Additionally, the Council is trialling the use of cones to place on corners where parking too close can block the line of sight. We would be grateful if you would work with us and other parishioners by not moving these cones
